Kia Ora from all the staff at Badminton Manawatu. Following are some of the highlights of the past season from organising events to junior representative badminton. We are grateful for all the financial funding and investment received which has enabled us to deliver quality events, competitions, and appropriate opportunities for all to participate. Thanks to our Board and team of volunteers that never fail to support and help grow the aroha of the game of badminton. Thanks again to Stephen and the team in Badminton New Zealand for their continued and valued support of our association.



Shuttle Time Delivery

Shuttle Time is the basis of our junior badminton outside of Junior Reps and is delivered by the staff Josh, Sandra and Wynn. We deliver this in schools, before & after school clubs, school holiday programmes, through skills classes and in School Comps at Arena. In 2023 we delivered in Palmerston North, Feilding, Dannevirke, Woodville, Foxton and Levin. With thanks to Sport Manawatu's Tu Manawa Fund we were able to provide access to children who would not have the opportunity to be introduced to and play badminton. Most of these schools visited in the latter half of the year have not had a badminton program in a while and do not have the proper facilities or equipment for badminton; as a result our coaches take with them pop-up nets, 20 to 30 rackets and shuttles for each day's use. Some of these schools are located in the distant smaller towns over the ranges. Wynn has commented that it is rewarding to see the students' excitement learning badminton. We hope to continue our partnership with Tu Manawa and deliver more of these sessions to more schools in the future.

There are many other groups that play throughout the community, and we try to provide support for them if needed.

Central Regions Administration and Badminton Hawkes Bay support

As an Association we are also heavily engaged with Badminton NZ, representing Manawatu & the Central Regions on several of their committees through Sandra and James. Badminton Manawatu are also in the process of providing governance and operational support to Badminton Hawke's Bay, with the cooperation of Sport Hawke's Bay, Badminton NZ and the BHB Committee. Players may have noticed that no Hawke's Bay teams were entered into any junior tournaments this year. Over the next 12-18 months we will help them re-establish a network of junior badminton opportunities and competitions. After a turbulent start to 2023 with extreme weather events, we are hoping HB will benefit HB from our support and the wider CR with increased competition for all players.



40 Years of New Zealand Junior Championships in Palmerston North

For generations, this event has been the pinnacle of excitement for junior players, and it is time where we celebrate this remarkable occasion. For 40 years, aspiring juniors from all around the country have come together, proudly representing their associations, embarking on memorable journeys, forging new friendships, and creating lifelong memories along the way.

NZJTC has evolved throughout the years and it has become known as a crucial stepping stone for young talent, providing a platform for both budding beginners and high-performing athletes to shine. It is an exceptional



opportunity for newcomers to learn from experienced players, honing their skills while immersing themselves in the vibrant badminton community.

Richard Skarott, a Manawatu representative and one of the pillars of the event, succinctly captures the essence of the long-standing event, acknowledging how everyone "values the contacts and friendships made over the years. It's fantastic to see players go on to be integral parts of their association teams or to higher honours." Over the decades, the venue has also undergone many changes, from a rubber compound on concrete to sprung wooden floors and expanding the capacity to accommodate the growing demand. With an impressive 24 courts in regular use and a staggering 38 courts for this year, Palmerston North continues to raise the bar for excellence.

Behind this grand event stands an extraordinary team of dedicated volunteers, some of whom have been involved for over 30 years. Among them, Janice Cudby has served in various roles such as Treasurer, Event Director, President, and now Referee. Janice and her fellow volunteers share a deep passion for nurturing young talents and witnessing their growth in the sport as they progress through the age groups. Despite the challenges faced over the years, from snowstorms to leaking roofs and even the unforeseen impacts of Covid, the spirit of the event perseveres.

Janice remarks, "The show must go on," and with a wealth of experience and resilience, the team stands ready to overcome any obstacles that may arise.

Para Badminton

An incredible medal haul for New Zealand at the Oceania Para Badminton Championships in October 2023, with five Oceania titles from our team of six Para athletes! Manawatu athlete Oliver Linton and his longtime coach Josh Curry headed to the Championships. Oliver continues to train in Palmerston North and has been nominated for further professional development by Badminton NZ in 2024.

Competitions and Sanctioned Events

Manawatu ABCD Champs 2023 was another huge individual tournament despite a clash with the Wellington North BCD on the same weekend. Despite this, we had 109 players enter, with 97 from Manawatu alone! We ran 17 events with 124 entries over the two days. The very high local engagement with the Manawatu ABCD Champs indicates the demand for this type of tournament. The 2024 edition has already been locked in for Arena and careful to avoid clashes with additional similar events being held in Whanganui, Wellington, Wellington North & Hutt Valley.

The Manawatu Open 2023 and North Island / Manawatu u17 Championships 2023 saw around 82% and 65%, respectfully, of participants not from Palmerston North, which is higher than in previous years. The Open had a total of 62 players and 89 entries. These numbers are set to balloon in 2024 with the Manawatu Open joining the NZ Tour to replace the Wellington North Open. We are excited to welcome the best players in New Zealand and keen to see how our local players compete against them. The u17 Champs ran 7 events and had 46 participants and 97 entries.

The Manawatu u15 Open 2023 and Manawatu u19 Open 2023 had a combined total of 83 players and 154 entries across the 10 main draw events. While u15 entries were much greater, the amount of u19 entries was very good, likely down to the timing of the tournament before the school exam period. Manawatu players were 46% of the u15 draw and just 24& of the u19 draw, highlighting the demand for sanctioned tournaments within our region and the prominent role Manawatu plays in delivering a quality experience for those who participate.

Unfortunately, the planned Manawatu Masters Open was cancelled due to insufficient entries. Given the lack of interest there is no plan to run another sanctioned masters event in the foreseeable future.

We would like to say a big thank you to our volunteer officials for assisting us to continue to deliver quality local events — Janice, Richard and Greg. Another thanks to Sport Manawatu and the Palmerston North City Council for their investment which enables us to attract participants from all over New Zealand.







Schools Competitions

It was another full and successful year for school competition participation, offering a structured and social opportunity for school aged players to continue playing outside of school. The in-school and after-school Shuttle Time programme helps to generate interest in playing badminton, strengthening the pathway within primary and intermediate schools into our school competitions.

The Tu Manawatu Active Aotearoa fund administered through Sport Manawatu enables us to successfully deliver and activate badminton throughout our inactive community groups or schools.



Thursday Night Badminton League



TNBL ran for the entire year and provides a regular socially competitive double match-play environment for players of all abilities, without the need for months-long commitment. We managed to complete a whooping 9 rounds in total over 43 weeks. However, this was only possible with the help and assistance from the Arena as we were able to secure additional weeks previously unavailable to us in past years. This year saw an increase in the social grades with many new family and school teams taking part once again. This source of teams has taken over completely from the flow of teams from local clubs.

In 2023, we had 41 different teams compete with 16 playing in every round and a further 9 teams competing in 6 or more rounds. A total of 6681 games were played in 2990 matches in 510 ties over the year. This translates to 234,810 points played! The age range goes from 7 years old to 75 years old and we continue to provide an event that

caters for everyone in the rohe, no matter what age or ability. Thanks to our

main volunteer Richard Skarott for his time and reporting skills, and those that step in when required.



Fundraising

We continued to fundraise and apply for funding in 2023. Thursday Night Badminton League continues to be our biggest revenue earner, again thanks to James for managing this and Richard for volunteering every Thursday. The income from our other competitions (day-events and schools competitions) also assists with funding the operations of our association.

Our Racket stringing service continues to create income for the association with particular thanks to our stringer Richard Skarott.

The professionalism and quality of our competitions also attracts schools players and players from the wider community. School's competitions have increased year on year even through COVID times showing us that the tamariki and rangatahi have an appetite to participate in this sport. Entry fees for these tournaments assists the association to continue to develop our sport.

Yonex rackets and grips were also available to buy from the MBA and this provides us with some extra income for our activities. Shuttles are also available to purchase.
